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The Seas, Rivers, Islands and Coastal Areas Intergroup had a debate on seaweed aquaculture on 26 February 2019 at the European Parliament in Brussels. The aims were to discuss balanced and long-term recommendations based on a detailed analysis of current seaweed aquaculture practices, regulations, health benefits and consumer demands, with a focus on the protection of the marine environment.
